
Egg Hunt & Potluck: Our annual egg hunt will be held Friday, March 29th. The children will be searching for eggs filled with goodies on the playground. Each class will be hosting a potluck on the same day as the egg hunt. If you'd like to participate, please sign up for a dish or side outside of the classroom door. Make sure to have your dish in the classroom by 11:00 as the children have lunch at 11:15. Please note, we cannot refrigerate or heat up any items at the school. They will have to be ready to serve or placed in an appropriate insulated bag if you drop them off early. All children with food allergies should have lunch brought from home. If you do not wish for your child to participate in the potluck lunch, please bring their packed lunch as usual.

Morning Drop Off/Afternoon Pick up: Classes start promptly at 9:00 am and conclude at 12:00 pm for our half-day students and 3:00pm for our full day students. There is a <u>15-minute grace</u> <u>period</u> during morning drop-off. We encourage all students to be dropped off during the grace period, to ensure a smooth transition into their school day.



For the month of March, we will be touring the southern hemisphere and will visit Australia. We will focus on landmarks of Australia and learn about the physical features. We will also be learning about the most iconic features of Australia. The Australian outback, the Mariana trench and the scenic coasts will be interesting information for the children. I am sure they will be excited to learn about the unique animals, especially the koala bear, the kangaroo, and the wombat. For zoology, we will learn about the lifecycle of a butterfly and parts of an insect. I know they will enjoy my presentation of the lifecycle of a butterfly! We will also focus on learning about measuring temperature. For botany, we will learn about parts of a seed. For our Spanish lesson we will be focusing on parts of a seed. Our study of the land and water forms will focus on water bodies such as lakes, archipelago, and harbor. The children will listen to the musical instrument called Didgeridoo. This is a wind instrument developed by the aboriginal people from north Australia. It has a distinct sound and is popular even today. We will also learn about the famous abstract artwork of Wassily Kandinsky. Our writing project will be focused on short sentences about St. Patrick's Day and Dr. Seuss as we celebrate his birthday on March 2nd.

We encourage all children to bring items such as pictures, trophies, medals, or books for share day every Friday. They can also share an experience verbally. PLEASE do not send toys as they are a distraction for all.

I would like to begin by thanking you for showering us with sweet treats and love for Valentine's Day in February. Thank you to all!

As we leap into March, our ship is sailing to the Land Down Under! Yes. We are visiting Australia, learning about the aborigines, their Art, the states, food, and the culture of the country. I am sure many children will be sharing fun stories at the end of the day! Do you know how many teeth a platypus has or how long it takes a Tasmanian Devil to eat a whole chicken? Towards the end of the lesson, please ask your child. We will watch an educational video of Australia, listen to Aboriginal music and work on artwork related to Australian animals, using aboriginal art technique.

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The children enjoyed studying about various animals last month. We will take this study to another level by learning about Ocean Life and Ocean animals. They will learn Spanish terms for items of furniture for Spanish class. With Spring around the corner, the children will learn about the life cycle of a hen.

Dr. Seuss' birthday will be celebrated on February 29th by reading one of his books. Please feel free to send your child's favorite Dr. Seuss' book to be shared and read in class during the first week of March. This is a fun series which teaches and interests the child to rhyming words. During March, our classroom will be decorated with shamrocks and hopefully we will be visited by a leprechaun on the 16th. This time we are going to be successful catching it. For the monthly cooking project, we will cook "Green Eggs and Ham" after reading the book. I hope most of the children will try eating some!

I would also like to remind parents that Friday is our Share Day. Children have fun sharing and getting an experience with group participation while sharing. Kindly send a share (not a toy) so they can show and tell. A share can also be in the form of a skill such as showing martial arts, singing, dancing to the child's favorite song on CD, a trophy received for sports or speaking about a holiday experience. The indirect aim of our Friday share is to help the children build confidence and participate in group discussions. It also helps the child to overcome the fear of public speaking. So, I kindly request you to help your child choose an item to bring on Friday for share. Allow him/her to put it in the share basket, which will make them remember what they brought when it is their turn to share. Kindly write your child's name inside the books/items as confusions may occur.

This month we are visiting the continent of Europe. I will be introducing the continent map naming many countries that make up this area. We will learn about famous landmarks, animals, and other facts about the rich history of Europe. We will learn about the life and paintings of one of the most famous artists from this continent, Vincent Van Gough. Children will get the opportunity to recreate their own versions of his famous painting.
