<u>Re-Enrollment:</u> Re-enrollment will be taking place for the upcoming summer and the **2025-2026 School Year** between **Monday, February 24th - Monday, March 10th.** We offer placement for summer and fall to existing students before we open to our wait list. We have emailed the packet out, let us know if you have not received it.

Please make sure to return your re-enrollment forms no later than <u>Monday, March 10th</u>, to ensure placement for the upcoming summer sessions and fall. We will open enrollment to new students after this date and will be unable to guarantee any late registrations we receive.

<u>Morning Drop Off/Afternoon Pick up:</u> Classes start promptly at 9:00 am and conclude at 12:00 pm for our half-day students and 3:00pm for our full day students. There is a <u>15-minute grace period</u> during morning dropoff. We encourage all students to be dropped off during the grace period, to ensure a smooth transition into their school day.

Happy March! Last month gave the children a chance to learn about kindness and love. They also explored their creative side and enjoyed recreating Jim Dine's artwork. For the month of March, we will be touring the southern hemisphere and will visit Australia. We will focus on landmarks of Australia and learn about the physical features. We will also be learning about the most iconic features of Australia. The Australian outback, the Mariana trench and the scenic coasts will be interesting information for the children. I am sure they will be excited to learn about the unique animals, especially the koala bear, the kangaroo, and the wombat. For zoology, we will learn about the lifecycle of a butterfly and parts of an insect. I know they will enjoy my presentation of the lifecycle of a butterfly! We will also focus on learning about measuring temperature. For botany, we will learn about parts of a seed. For our Spanish lesson we will be focusing on parts of a seed. Our study of the land and water forms will focus on water bodies such as lakes, archipelago, and harbor. The children will listen to the musical instrument called Didgeridoo. This is a wind instrument developed by the aboriginal people from north Australia. It has a distinct sound and is popular even today. We will also learn about the famous abstract artwork of Wassily Kandinsky. Our writing project will be focused on short sentences about St. Patrick's Day and Dr. Seuss as we celebrate his birthday on March 2nd.

We encourage all children to bring items such as pictures, trophies, medals, or books for share day every Friday. They can also share an experience verbally. PLEASE do not send toys as they are a distraction for all.

We will be reading books written by Dr. Seuss in honor of his birthday on March 2nd. His books teach children how to rhyme and have fun with words. Please feel free to send a Dr. Seuss book for share on Friday. Our cooking project for the month will be themed around his book, Green Eggs & Ham. We will be making green eggs and ham in class, and I will let you know who will be brave enough to eat that!

With African drums beating....dum..dum..dum..we are going on a safari to Africa to discover the countries and its geographic region on the world map. We will learn about the unique animals, the people and their lives, their food and clothing. I will also introduce them to the flags of some countries. We will listen to sounds of African drumbeats and the great artist Tinga Tinga and her art will be introduced for art class. The children will work on silhouettes of animals gazing at the sunset.

Our Spanish lesson for March is all about transportation. The children will be learning about the modes of transportation, by air, land or water. We will learn the terms for vehicles in Spanish class as well. We will also learn about parts of a turtle, work on three-part cards and puzzles.

Last month we explored the smallest continent, Australia. We learned about many fascinating animals such as the marsupials and about the Great Barrier Reef. Children also had a chance to witness the process of seed germination right in our classroom.

This month, we are going to learn about the continent of Europe. We'll explore its famous landmarks such as the Eiffel Tower, Leaning Tower of Pisa, ancient castles and ruins. Along with landmarks, we will learn about some of the animals native to the continent. Throughout the month, we'll listen to classical music by Beethoven and Mozart. Our artist of the month is Wassily Kandinsky. We are going to replicate his famous artwork, "Many Circles"

For the subject of Botany, children will be introduced to the parts of a flower. They will be dissecting a flower to observe all the parts inside and out. I am sure they will have fun with this fictitious figure! This will also be a good opportunity to introduce the colors of the rainbow. The children will get a chance to paint their own rainbows, and I look forward to displaying them in the room.
