Hello Parents,

I hope everyone had a good spring break.

This month we will be traveling to the home of fascinating and deadly creatures such as electric eels, flesh eating piranhas, poison dart frogs, jaguars, and some seriously venomous snakes. This is the Amazon rainforest located on the continent of South America! We will explore the layers of the rainforest and the amazing landmarks such as Machu Pichu, La Mano, Punta Del Este, Tierra del Fuego national park and Tutelar figures located in Chile. The children will watch a short documentary depicting the lush landscape and the unique flora and fauna of the region.

We will be introducing the life cycle of a butterfly as we observe our caterpillars turning into beautiful monarch butterflies. We will be listening to Latin dance music based on popular dance routines such as the Salsa and the Tango. We will also watch a video of these dances. In Spanish, we will be learning the days of the week and in cooking, we will be making a Brazilian classic, Brazilian pineapples using pineapple pieces dipped in brown sugar and cinnamon. In art, we will be recreating an exploratory project, the Peruvian drawing of the Nazca lines.

We are extremely excited to celebrate Mother's Day this year and I look forward to seeing all the moms join us for breakfast on Friday, May 9th from 8:00 am to 9:00 am. The children will be working on a writing project, will make cards and have a special gift for moms in honor of this special day!

Welcome Back! We hope everyone enjoyed a restful and refreshing Spring Recess!

As we step into the month of May, our Montessori journey continues with exciting new adventures. This month, we'll be traveling across the vibrant continent of South America! We'll take an imaginary cruise through the Rainforest, discovering its unique animals, exploring different countries, and tasting some of the delicious foods from the region. We'll also be listening to the joyful rhythms of Samba music through the month. While enjoying so much from South America, we will enjoy making Cholados (Colombian Snow Cones with Fruit). A cholado is a creamy combination of a snow cone and a fruit cocktail. This combination of fruit syrup, sweetened condensed milk, and tropical fruits over crushed ice is a refreshing, favorite way to cool off on a warm day in Colombia.

In Zoology, the children will explore the life cycle of a butterfly—from tiny larvae to fluttering wings—as we observe real caterpillars grow and eventually release them back into nature. We'll also take a closer look at other insects, learning about their parts and their important roles in the ecosystem.

For our budding artists, May brings a creative project inspired by Frida Kahlo. The children will be introduced to the Monart method, receiving step-by-step guidance to create their own Frida-style portraits.

In Spanish, we'll focus on learning the names of various fruits, adding color and flavor to our vocabulary!
