When: Friday, October 31st Where: Valley Gardens Center Time: 9:30 a.m. (Toddlers, followed by Preschoolers & Elementary)


Please note: October 31st is an early dismissal day. All children must be picked up by 3:00 p.m.

Please have your child come to school dressed in their costume, with a change of clothes packed in a labeled bag. More information will be posted soon. Remember, no pretend weapons or scary masks are allowed on school premises at any time.

Afterschool Classes: Classes will begin on October 1st. If your child is signed up for an afterschool activity, please remember to pick them up promptly after the class ends. Please submit your payment directly to the teacher leading the class. If you are paying with cash or check, you may also drop off your payment at the office. Accepted payment methods are posted on the board in the hallway.

Morning Drop Off/Afternoon Pick up: Classes begin promptly at 9:00 a.m. and end at 12:00 p.m. for half-day students and 3:00 p.m. for full-day students. Drop-off is between 8:45 and 9:00 a.m. to ensure a smooth start to the day. When dropping off on the playground, please keep goodbyes brief to allow children to transition and connect with their peers and teachers. Parents are welcome to observe through the classroom windows. Afternoon daycare must be pre-arranged with the office. Occasional care is available at \$20.00 per hour and will be billed if your child is picked up after 3:15 p.m. Please call ahead to confirm availability. If you arrive late, quietly drop your child off in class and a teacher will escort them to morning circle. Please ensure your child is picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

Hello Parents,

We had a great first month back at school and we are ready to enjoy the fun month of October!
