- Art: Winter Art
- Music: Discovering the Nutcracker through music, story, and craft.

Cultural Studies - Antarctica & the Polar Regions

In December, the children of Room 5 will explore Antarctica and its location on the world map. We will discuss the unique characteristics of this continent and its climate.

Zoology – **Penguins & Arctic Animals:** Through 3-part cards, classified pictures, and books, the children will study several types of penguins and Arctic animals. A consistent classroom favorite continues to be the Macaroni Penguin!

Spanish: This month's focus will be on numbers, with opportunities to practice counting and number identification in Spanish through songs, games, and hands-on materials.

Botany – **Leaves:** We will explore the parts of a leaf and learn to classify different types of leaves using Montessori Botany materials. The children will also go on a leaf hunt outdoors and compare their findings to our classroom leaf chart.

Geography – **Land and Water Forms:** In Geography, the children will be introduced to foundational land and water forms, beginning with island and lake, using objects, picture cards, and real-world examples.

Geometry – **Geometric Solids:** As part of our geometry classification work, the children will learn the names of the Geometric Solids and identify these shapes in the environment around them.

Composer of the Month – **Michael Jackson:** In Music, we will learn about the life and work of Michael Jackson. The children will enjoy listening to his lively rhythms during their work cycle—you may be surprised by how peacefully they work during the Thriller album! The upbeat tempo will also help us prepare for our upcoming holiday performance.

Our holiday show will take place on Thursday, December 11th at 10:45 a.m. in Room 5. Following the performance, we will gather for our International Potluck. A sign-up sheet will be posted on the classroom door. I am excited to see the wonderful dishes your families will share. I will be bringing a few Sri Lankan delicacies for everyone to enjoy!
